

Debut film – premiere on documentary film festival in Germany



For the first time after completion of the debut film "The Timebank – an economy for everyone" in February 2007, the reception of international awards and great success in worldwide distribution (TV and DVD market as well as through different online platforms), a German festival committee has now also recognized the actuality and quality of this documentary.
